- 2. "Draft" 5 items.
- 3. Based on the items your group has, develop a story.
- 4. Establish roles: Actors, Cinematographer, Director
- 5. Planning: Storyboard, Location scout, time to film
- 6. Shoot the film
- 7. Edit individually you will end up with 3-6 versions of your movie
- 8. Submit your individual project
- 9. Watch each other's versions and choose the BEST version.
- 10. Collaborate as a group to make necessary edits to make the chosen version as close to perfect as possible.
- 11. You must be present and on time for the MAJORITY of class periods for the project to count for your grade.
